

Basic Test Day Checklist

There are only a few things that your student(s) will need to bring to testing and a lot of things that are better off left at home.

Where to report:

- All testers will be prompted to head to their assigned testing location (posted) at our normal, school start time (7:17 am).
- Busing will be available to all testers.
- Breakfast will be available for purchase as it is normally (No change for free/reduced).

What to bring:

- An [approved calculator](#). *Please bring your own if you have one, along with extra batteries. If you need to borrow a school calculator, notify your ELA teacher and they will add you to the list. We will do our best to accommodate student calculator needs.

What not to bring:

- No electronic devices! This includes phones & smartwatches! They will not be allowed in the testing or break areas and should be left at home. This includes ALL electronic equipment (i.e. phones, smartwatches, earbuds, laptops, tablets, etc.)!
- No protractors, compasses, or rulers.
- No highlighters, colored pencils, mechanical pencils.
- No food or drinks – including bottled water – unless approved by the College Board’s Services for Students with Disabilities.
- No headphones or noise cancellation devices - such as earplugs – unless approved by the College Board’s Services for Students with Disabilities.

During the test:

You will be allowed to have only these items on your desk:

- Test Book
- Answer Sheet
- #2 Pencils & Erasers
- Approved Calculator (during appropriate sections only)

All electronic devices, including smartwatches, should be left at home. If you forget to leave electronic devices home, they must be powered off throughout the duration of the test (even during breaks). You will be dismissed immediately and your scores will be cancelled if you use your phone/electronic device or if it makes a noise (even during breaks).
