



Congratulations to the Anchor Bay High School 9th Grade Symphonic Band, Cadet/Concert Band, Symphonic Band, and Wind Ensemble. On Thursday, March 7th and Friday, March 8th, the bands participated in the District 16 MSBOA Band Festival hosted here at Anchor Bay High School. In the five performance categories of Tone, Intonation, Rhythm, Technique, and Inter-

pretation, the panel of four adjudicators awarded each of the four ABHS ensembles with an overall SUPERIOR First Division rating. Of the 20 performance grades, the Cadet/Concert Band received 10 A's, the 9th Grade Symphonic Band received 17 A's, the Symphonic Band received 16 A's, and the Wind Ensemble received 20 A's with eight A+'s and two A++s! This is in addition to both MS North and MS South having wonderful performances at the MSBOA Middle School Band Festival during their respective events. It is the 25th year in a row that the Wind Ensemble received a First Division, and the 27th year in a row that the Symphonic Band received a First Division at this annual assessment for concert bands in the state of Michigan. Olivia Barchi placed sixth and Maddy Alef placed first overall in the Novice States Poetry event. Our team received team trophy, placing third in Division 2.

Finally, the Anchor Bay High School forensics team was represented by seven entries at the Warrior Forensic Tournament hosted by Walled Lake Western High School on March 16th. Two of our competitors advanced to semi-final rounds; Kyla Cori in Poetry and Cadence Lowran in Program Oral Interpretation.

Congratulations are due to our speakers and interpreters for their hard work and dedication over the course of this rigorous season.

#### STUDENTS SIGNING OUT 🏾 🌑



When a parent or guardian gives permission for their student to leave school for emergency or medical appointments, the following must be adhered to for dismissal:

- 1. If parent/quardian is picking the student up, the parent needs to come into the building (I.D. is required) and sign the student out.
- 2. If the student has a vehicle at school the Parent/guardian can call the counseling office and speak to a secretary. A secretary will then call the student out of class, sign them out, and give them a pass.
- 3. Parents can write a note stating date, time, reason for student to be released, and a phone number where they can be reached. The note must be brought to the counseling office before school in the morning. The secretary will then call the parent to confirm the note and times indicated. PARENTS WILL BE CALLED ON ALL NOTES FOR THE SAFETY OF YOUR SON/ DAUGHTER. If we are unable to get in contact with the parent to confirm note, your student will be unable to be released. Once we have contacted parents and an excused pass has been written, it is the student's responsibility to come to the office to get the pass before he/she leaves the campus. If he/she leaves without signing out in the office, the student will be unexcused.

#### ABHS CLOSED CAMPUS POLICY

We have a closed campus policy at Anchor Bay High School which means that students are required to stay in school during lunch hour. Student may not exit the cafeteria during lunch without permission since classes are in session.

#### STUDENT BOOK DEBTS

Please remind your student that when he/she is assigned a textbook that they return the book to the teacher who issued it to them. Students will sign their initials upon receipt and return of their textbooks. This will ensure that your student will not obtain a book debt at the end of the school year.

#### REMEMBER, YOUR' NOT JUST MAINTAINING YOUR CAR

Did you know that just four quarts of oil can form an eight-acre oil slick if spilled or dumped down a storm drain? With over four million vehicles in Southeast Michigan, we all need to practice good car care to protect our lakes and streams.

How does caring for you car affect our waterways? Storm drains found in our streets and yards and roadside ditches lead directly to our lakes and streams. So, if motor oil and other fluids are dumped or washed into the storm drain, they pollute our local waterways.

What can you do? Simple.

- Maintain it. Keep your vehicle properly tuned and use the owner's manual to guide decisions about how often it is necessary to change fluids such as oil and antifreeze.
- Take advantage of business expertise. Consider taking your vehicle to the shop to have the oil and other fluids changed. These businesses have the ability to recycle the used materials and clean up accidental spills.
- **Recycle.** If you choose to change your oil and other fluids yourself, label the waste containers. Then take them to your community's household hazardous waste collection day or to a business that accepts used oil. Never dump used oil antifreeze or other fluids on the ground or down the storm drain.
- Soak it up. Use kitty litter promptly to absorb small amounts of spilled vehicle fluids. Then sweep it into a bag and throw it in the trash. Don't leave these spills or wash them off pavement. They'll be flushed into the storm drains.
- **Do it under cover**. Whenever possible, perform vehicle maintenance in a well ventilated, but covered location. This minimizes the potential for rainfall to wash those inevitable spills and rips into our lakes and streams.
