- The boys' track & field team participated in three invitationals over the weekend. On Thursday, two days after a hard day of competing vs. Romeo (both chasing heights and battling conditions) our vaulters went to Fraser for the Fly Fraser Fly PV meet. Led by [Mitchel Morrison](#) the Tars had 5 jumpers over opening. On Friday, the Tars split into two small individual groups as many of our distance runners went to Romeo's Barnyard Invitational and Elite Mile Showcase where every single runner recorded a season-best time. Highlights were Aaron Osterman winning his heat and rolling to a 9th place overall finish in a PR time of 2:05.79. In the 1600, Zach Rubicz ran in the elite division and battled his way to a time of 4:31.86. The main highlight of the evening came from [Thomas Westphal](#) in a race the entire state track and field community was watching and it did not disappoint. It was an epic battle between a group of runners who have many more battles to contest not only at this level but also at the next. Thomes finished 3rd but in the process set a new school record of 4:09.14 as he continues to ensure records that will not be broken for a long time. Meanwhile, just a few miles down the street, a gang of four represented the Tar men at the Richmond Blue Devil Invitational. Between them, they scored 51 points in 4 events as Jonah Konarz swept the 110 and 300 hurdles in season-best times while [Aiden Champagne](#) finished 2nd in the 300s in his FIRST time competing in the event. Cameron Gramzow out threw the competition by more than 11 feet in discus while Matt Grawburg won the shot put by 3 feet. On Saturday, at the Oxford Invitational, Luke Bowman rolled past the competition (wheelers from 2 other schools) in his 3 racing events and also claimed the shot put title.
