STAFF APPRECIATION

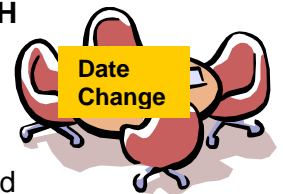

MORNING DROP OFF TIME

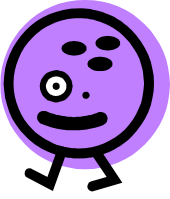
