FIELD TRIPS: Our 5th graders participated in STARBASE Program. The goal of STARBASE is to motivate elementary school students to explore Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) as they continue their education. The program encourages students to set goals and achieve them. STARBASE engages students through an inquiry-based curriculum with its "hands-on, mind-on" experiential activities. Math is embedded throughout the curriculum, and teamwork is stressed as students work together to explore, explain, elaborate and evaluate concepts. Our 5th grade focused on the following courses: The engineering & design process, teamwork, prototyping, Newton's 3 laws of motion, chemistry & molecular models, physical & chemical changes, fluidity & buoyancy, energy & circuits, chromatography.

That is why we are using lessons from P2 to help develop character that will inspire positive relationships (student-to-student and student-to-teacher) and cultivate a positive culture in our community. If students read 6,000 books school-wide by the end of the month, there will be a surprise reward. READING MINUTES TRACKER: We are sending home a fun game to complete over the next month. (March 1st -March 31st) Students will be given a Reading Minutes Tracker sheet. When the entire sheet is filled out, a parent or guardian signs the bottom and returns the sheet to their teacher.
