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

# Message From the Superintendent

Dear Parents and Community Members,

As we begin work on implementing our new strategic plan and bond initiatives, I wanted to take a moment to share our plan to greater incorporate career preparation into classrooms across the various grade levels over the next decade.

At the elementary level, the plan is to develop a system where students can begin to get exposure to a wide variety of careers. This would include having professionals from various vocations and



In middle school, students will have the opportunity to take introductory courses in various career areas and begin examining career interests and aptitudes. These one–term courses will enable students to experience a broad spectrum of career fields. Design and problem-solving challenges will be more industry focused, and students will have opportunities to begin job shadowing and attending field trips into workplaces to broaden their horizons of various career fields and to change their perceptions of high-demand career pathways. Students will progress according to competencies instead of by age, thus ensuring they have developed the skills and aptitudes necessary for their chosen career interests.

Finally, at the high school level, all students will have the opportunity to take career and college readiness courses and could graduate with college credits, career experiences, or industry-recognized certifications that will enable them to gain above entry-level positions in their chosen career field. Core courses will be designed to address industry-focused competencies, and students wanting to earn a degree or certification will be able to earn college credits and internship experiences that will give them real-world, practical experience in their career pathway.

We look forward to working with our local businesses and college partners over the next several years to develop these opportunities, and we thank the community for its support in making it possible for our students.







# What are Career Pathways?

Anchor Bay, through the passing of the 2022 Bond, will be implementing Career Pathways for students. Some of the first bond renovation work will create the Career Pathway Framework including locating all 16 CTE programs at Anchor Bay High School. This reconfiguring of the CTE programs will not only bolster Anchor Bay students' opportunities, it will also allow for the district to integrate Career Exploration Classes for all K-12 students.

Why are career pathways important in school? It allows students to connect what they are learning in the classroom to possible future careers. Pathways provide the structure to guide students toward well paying, skilled fields. Students gain education, training, and support services while they acquire marketable skills before graduation!

# Kindergarten Registration & Schools of Choice for the 2023-2024 School Year is Now Open!

### 3 Options for Kindergarten-Age Children

### **FULL- DAY KINDERGARTEN**

 Children must be 5 years old by Sept.1 of the school year in which they plan on attending Kindergarten.

### HALF- DAY KINDERGARTEN

 Students continue on to Kindergarten or 1<sup>st</sup> Grade the following year based on progress.

Full-day and half-day curriculum is based on the Michigan Standards for Kindergarten.

### **YOUNG FIVES**

- Young Fives is a full day program.
- Designed for children turning 5 years old between June 1<sup>st</sup> and December 1<sup>st</sup>.
- The Young Fives curriculum is based on the Michigan Standards for Kindergarten modified to meet the foundational academic, social/ emotional, and developmental needs for younger children.
- Students will enter Kindergarten the following school year.

# ONLINE ENROLLMENT & ANNUAL REGISTRATION SYSTEM

# **NEW STUDENTS**

New K-12 Resident and Schools of Choice students will use the pre-registration link located on the district homepage.

This online process will replace the paper enrollment and Schools of Choice application process. If you do not have access to a phone or computer to fill out the forms, a time can be scheduled to come in and fill out the forms at one of our buildings.

### **Steps:**

- 1. Click the link to fill out the pre-registration form for **new** K-12 resident students and **new** School of Choice applicants. Current GSRP families will be given their access code to enroll for kindergarten.
- 2. You will receive an email confirmation that your preregistration was received.
- 3. Please allow 7-10 business days for approval. We will be verifying the information you submitted on the form.
- Once approved, you will receive an email to create your parent portal account to access the online enrollment forms.
- 5. Enrollment forms for your new student will be found in your parent portal.
- 6. Fill out the enrollment forms online. Required documents can be uploaded in the Parent Portal or you can schedule a time to drop off required documents including birth certificate, vaccination records, etc. to your building or the administration center.

### **Preschool Families:**

**GSRP** will NOT use this online registration form. Please call the Early Childhood Center at 586-716-7862.

**ECSE** families need to call Special Services at 586-949-4513 for approval before doing the online enrollment process.

## **EXISTING STUDENTS**

### **All Returning Students**

All existing Anchor Bay students will use the online process for returning to school in the fall! Parents will need to log into their parent portal account and fill out "Annual Update" forms for their students. These forms will replace the paper forms that were sent home at the beginning of the school year to confirm items such as emergency contacts and health conditions.

It will be required that every student have these forms filled out by their parent/guardian. We anticipate that this process will start in late-July. We will send out a SchoolMessenger and post information on our website and social media accounts.

Make sure you can log into your Parent Portal account and have access to all your students!

### **Move Outs**

Did you move out of the district and want to remain at Anchor Bay through Schools of Choice? Log on to your parent portal account to access the Schools of Choice form. Go to "Forms", then "Enrollment", and fill out "2023-2024 Out of district Schools of Choice Application."

### **In-District Transfers**

Anchor Bay residents that are requesting a building other than their resident building can fill out the In-District Transfer form. Log on to your parent portal account to access the Schools of Choice form. Go to "Forms", then "Enrollment", and fill out "2023-2024 In District Transfer." If you do not have a parent portal account, contact your building's office to receive an access code.
