As indicated in the chart above, six of our schools in Anchor Bay were recognized as Reward Schools, placing them among the top performing schools in the state.

At the Anchor Bay School District, we are extremely proud of our academic achievement at all levels. We focus on continuous improvement by analyzing data and adjusting instructional practices as required. Our building-level administrators and teachers have been focused on student growth as indicated by NWEA in both Reading and Math.

We continue to use the Literacy Essentials as well as the IXL program in both Reading and Math to target our most at-risk learners at both the elementary and secondary levels. In the fall of 2023-24 we established Pathfinder teachers who worked with school administrators to identify power standards in all core curriculum areas. The alignment of these power standards continued this school year, ensuring we will have a guaranteed and viable curriculum k-12.
