At the Anchor Bay School District, we are extremely proud of our academic achievement at all levels. We focus on continuous improvement by analyzing data and adjusting instructional practices as required. Our building-level administrators and teachers have been focused on student growth as indicated by NWEA in both Reading and Math.

We continue to use the Literacy Essentials, UFLI, (University of Florida Literacy Initiative) Lexia, as well as the IXL program in both Reading and Math to target our most at-risk learners at both the elementary and secondary levels. Beginning in the fall of the 2022-23 school year we established Pathfinder teachers who work with school administrators to identify power standards in all core curriculum areas. The alignment of these power standards will continue into the summer to ensure we have a guaranteed and viable curriculum k-12.
