Basic Test Day Checklist

There are only a few things that your student(s) will need to bring to testing and a lot of things that are better off left at home.

Where to report:

- All testers will be prompted to head to their assigned testing location (posted) at our normal, school start time (7:17 am).
- Busing will be available to all testers.
- Breakfast will be available for purchase as it is normally (No change for free/reduced).

What to bring:

 An <u>approved calculator</u>. *Please bring your own if you have one, along with extra batteries. If you need to borrow a school calculator, notify your ELA teacher and they will add you to the list. <u>We will do our best to accommodate student calculator needs.</u>

What <u>not</u> to bring:

- <u>No</u> electronic devices! This includes phones & smartwatches! They will <u>not</u> be allowed in the testing <u>or</u> break areas and should be left at home. <u>This includes ALL electronic</u> <u>equipment (i.e. phones, smartwatches, earbuds, laptops, tablets, etc.)!</u>
- No protractors, compasses, or rulers.
- No highlighters, colored pencils, mechanical pencils.
- No food or drinks including bottled water unless approved by the College Board's Services for Students with Disabilities.
- <u>No</u> headphones or noise cancellation devices such as earplugs unless approved by the College Board's Services for Students with Disabilities.

During the test:

You will be allowed to have <u>only</u> these items on your desk:

- Test Book
- Answer Sheet
- #2 Pencils & Erasers
- Approved Calculator (during appropriate sections only)

<u>All</u> electronic devices, including smartwatches, should be left at home. If you forget to leave electronic devices home, they must be powered off throughout the duration of the test (<u>even during breaks</u>). You will be dismissed immediately and your scores will be cancelled if you use your phone/electronic device or if it makes a noise (<u>even during breaks</u>).
