

WELCOME TO ANCHOR BAY HIGH SCHOOL

Anchor Bay High School offers a wide selection of courses in academic, vocational, technological and enrichment areas. These courses are designed to meet the outcomes defined by the State of Michigan and requirements of the world of work. Students are encouraged to speak with counselors, parents and teachers about their future course choices.

Selecting classes is a very important process. The courses should meet the graduation requirements as well as prepare for life beyond high school. Parents are encouraged to be an active part of the course selection process with their student. Every attempt will be made to schedule the requested courses. Alternatives will be used if the requested elective classes are not available to complete a student's schedule. Students should choose their alternate classes with discretion as they <u>MIGHT</u> become part of their final schedule.

This course guide provides description of classes which may be offered for the school year. Actual class offerings will depend on total student requests. Some points to consider are:

#### AP AND HONORS COURSES ARE FULL YEAR COURSES AND ARE TO BE COMPLETED IF THE STUDENT HAS REQUESTED THE COURSE.

Anchor Bay offers honors and advanced placement classes that may require summer homework. **Students will not be allowed to drop the course for failure to complete summer homework.** 

Certain courses are offered off-campus (Anchor Bay Middle School – South). Check the course description to see if this applies to classes selected.

**Careful selection of courses is necessary.** The building's schedule is built on the students' requests, therefore, schedule changes become difficult. Please do not request changes.

## NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER REQUIREMENTS

The NCAA Clearinghouse is an organization which certifies whether prospective student athletes have accomplished basic initial academic eligibility requirements. This information describes how a student becomes eligible to receive an athletic scholarship.

In order for athletes to compete at the collegiate level in either the NCAA or the NAIA, a perspective athlete must be cleared by either association. To be cleared a student must register online at <u>https://www.eligibilitycenter.com</u> (NCAA) or <u>https://www.playnaia.org/</u> (NAIA). Eligibility requirements can be found at both websites. After the student-athlete has researched the requirements at the respective website, the student-athlete is advised to set-up a meeting with a counselor and high school coach to learn more about the eligibility process and how to apply to the NCAA or NAIA eligibility centers.

All classes do not meet the NCAA standards for core courses. Be sure to check core class requirements on the websites above.
