

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Maconce Families,

We are asking for your cooperation in keeping all children safe. You will be seeing new "caution" signs posted in the crosswalk area to help serve as a reminder to everyone. Officer O'Connor with the Clay Township Police Department assisted with dismissal and gave a few recommendations to share with you regarding traffic control.



## TRAFFIC CONTROL

School starts at 8:36 AM and ends at 3:32 PM for grades PreK-5. Students should not arrive before 8:25 AM because supervision is not available. The safety of our students is the most important goal during drop-off and pick-up. We all have the responsibility to see that **every** child is safe. In addition, we need to keep traffic moving to facilitate student arrival and dismissal in a timely way. It is imperative that the following rules are observed:

- The yellow-curbed area in front of the school is for drop off and pick-up only. Do not leave your vehicle. Keep moving forward as cars in front of you leave.
- Do not stop in the crosswalk area. Doing so creates unsafe conditions for pedestrians.
- If you would like to walk your child into the building, park in the designated center parking area.
- Students should not cross through the crosswalk to the parking lot without parent supervision. Do not let your child run between cars. Other drivers may not see your child.
- Be patient! You are training your child(ren) on how to follow rules and laws by the example you set.

## BUS STUDENTS

The District offers free bussing for students that reside in the Anchor Bay School District boundaries. Bus riders are required to follow all bus rules and instructions by the bus driver. Infractions of the bus rules may result in bus referrals issued by the bus driver. The principal will implement consequences on bus referrals issued. Continual infractions of the bus rules may result in the student's loss of bus riding privileges. Please refer to the student handbook for more information regarding transportation.
