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

Green Team and MJHS Have Teamed Up to Help Feed the Bay

Beginning January 8, 2023, a donation box will be in the commons at Anchor Bay Middle School North to collect shoe donations.

Have you cleaned out your closet lately? Those shoes that have been sitting there unworn, actually have value! We're collecting gently worn, used and new shoes and we need your help. We're looking for all sizes and all types of shoes: sneakers, boots, dress shoes, sandals, athletic, dance shoes and casual shoes. We want them all! (No boots that clip into skis or snowboards, please.)

Over the holidays, ask family and friends for shoe donations. Hosting a dinner, ask family and friends to bring their unwanted shoes.

Our goal is 2,500 pairs of shoes. If we collect 2,500 pairs of shoes, we can earn \$1,000 for Feed the Bay. The more shoes we collect, the more money we earn for Feed the Bay. Plus, we will keep all of those shoes out of landfills.

All donated shoes will be redistributed to microenterprise partners through Funds2Orgs, a for profit social enterprise, and used in developing nations for impoverished people to start their own businesses.

In the US alone, over 600 million pairs of shoes are thrown away per year. The materials used to manufacture a pair of shoes are created from chemical compounds that will create health hazards if left to disintegrate openly or in landfills. By donating your gently worn, used and news shoes to Anchor Bay Middle School North, your shoes are given a second chance to make a difference

Cedar Point Field Trip

Once again, this spring, 8th grade students who earned the privilege will be able to participate in the Cedar Point Trip on Friday, May 31, 2024. We will be selling the tickets starting the week of March 4, 2024. The cost of the trip is \$75.00. **There will be no refunds**. More information will be coming in March. The criteria for this trip are, "outstanding/excellent" and "satisfactory/good" for citizenship. A student receiving a total of six (6) demerit points will be excluded from the school trip program. Any student involved in a fight or referred for a major infraction of a violent nature will be excluded. Truancy students will also be excluded.

If bad weather necessitates closing school, all the major local television and radio stations will be notified including channels 2, 4, 6, 7, AM 950 and 760. During a recent school cancellation, we found that several parents were not receiving text messages from the District notifying them of the cancellation. We checked the reports that are issued by "School Messenger" and found that many of the text messages (SMS) were being reported as BLOCKED. This means that when you received a text message from School Messenger (number: 67587) during the initial set up, no response was sent back. School Messenger assumes that you DO NOT want text messages if they do not receive a response.

To correct this, please do the following: If you would like to receive text messages from Anchor Bay School District, send a text message to (68453) with the words "opt in" or "subscribe" as the message. DROP OFF/PICK UP

If you drive your child to or from school you will need to drive to the main parking lot. When you are dropping off your child please pull all the way up to the last stop sign that's on the side walk. This keeps the traffic pattern flowing and traffic back-ups to a minimum. You may also drop off your child in the parking lot along Ashley Street. **Do not drive in the bus loop to drop your child off**. Safety is the number one concern when driving around the school property.

DRESS CODE

Guidelines shall prohibit student dress or grooming practices which:

- Present a hazard to the health or safety to himself/herself or to other in school.
- Interfere with schoolwork, create disorder, or disrupt the educational program.
- Cause excessive ware or damage to school property
- Prevent the student from achieving his/her education objectives because of blocked vision or restricted movement.

A few examples of inappropriate attire include:

- Shirts or jeans with cuts or holes
- Bare midriff or backless tops (you should not be able to see bellybuttons or any skin on your stomach or back)
- Short shorts, short skirts
- Profane, negative or obscene writing or pictures
- Hats (no head cover), sunglasses
- Coats or jackets designed for outerwear
- Tank tops or transparent tops (shirts must have sleeves completely covering the outside point of the shoulders). No low cut or revealing dress or tops revealing cleavage.
- Clothing that has reference to drugs, alcohol, tobacco, sex, gangs, or illegal activities may not be worn.
- Clothing of appropriate size and worn in proper locations no sagging of the pants. Pants should not drag on the floor; a belt is recommended. Cuffs should be no wider than 8 inches.
- Wallet Chains, spiked jewelry, or other dangerous accessories.
- Visible tattoos, excessive writing on the skin (no face painting)
- Shoes, sandals, or boots must be worn at all times
- Breakaway clothing, snap pants, pajamas. Student dress and grooming should be clean and in good taste.

PROTECTING OUR WATER...IT'S AS EASY AS SEVEN SIMPLE STEPS

Did you know that over three million people depend on our lakes and streams for their drinking water?

And that in Southeast Michigan there are over 300,000 registered boaters and 3.5 million people visit a local park each year?

With this many people depending on our lakes and streams for drinking water and recreation, we need to be careful how we treat our water. You might not be able to see the stream or lake from your house, but it's there. It might be a small stream or ditch or even a storm drain in the street. All of these lead directly to our lakes and streams. So, what we do at home effects our water!

Here are seven simple steps you can take in your home and yard to protect our lakes and streams

- 1. Help keep pollution out of storm drains. Storm drains lead directly to our lakes and streams. So, never dump oil, pet waste, leaves, dirty water, or anything down a storm drain. Remember, only rain in the drain.
- 2. Fertilize caringly and sparingly. Excess fertilizer that gets into storm drains pollutes our lakes by causing large algae blooms and using up oxygen fish need to survive. Sweep excess fertilizer back onto your lawn, use a low or no phosphorus fertilizer,

- and have your soil tested to see what, if any, fertilizer is needed.
- 3. Carefully store and dispose of household cleaners, chemicals and oil. Instead of putting hazardous products like antifreeze, motor oil and pesticides in the trash, down the storm drain or on the ground, take them to a local hazardous waste collection day.
- 4. Clean up after your pet. Whether on a walk or in your yard, promptly clean up after your pet. Not only will you be a good neighbor, you will also protect our water from harmful bacteria.
- 5. **Practice good car care**. Consider taking your car to a car wash or washing your car on the grass.
- 6. Choose earth friendly landscaping. Protect your pets, kids and environment by using pesticides sparingly. Also, water your lawn only when it needs it and choose plants native to Michigan.
- 7. Save water. Over watering our lawns can easily carry pollution to the storm drains and to our lakes and streams. Consider using a broom instead of a hose to clean sidewalks and driveways. Direct hoses and sprinklers on the lawn, not the driveway. This will help save our lakes and streams and save you money.
