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# **Organization Tips**

## **School Lunch**

In middle school, students have a 30 minute lunch break in the middle of the school day. Students can bring their own lunch or buy a lunch from our "North Bay Café". All 6th grade students have the same lunch. 7th and 8th grade students have combined lunch. School lunch at the North Bay Café is \$2.65 and can be paid through a student account or cash.



### **BUSES**

Riding a bus is a privilege that can be taken away for poor behavior. It is very important that students follow the rules and expectations of the bus outlined in our code of conduct. Students not riding the bus are dropped off and picked up each day at the side of the school by Ashley street.

Anchor Bay Community Schools are committed to providing a great education in which ALL students feel welcome and safe. Our schools have rules and policies to ensure this environment. Bullying is not tolerated in our schools. Bullying is defined as: "A person is bullied when he or she is exposed, repeatedly and over time, to negative actions on the part of one or more other persons, and he or she has difficulty defending himself or herself."
