For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2018-19. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2017-18. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2016-17. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. **Our school has not been given one of these labels.** 

The staff at Anchor Bay Middle School South continually reviews student achievement data to identify areas that present challenges. The staff also analyzes their curriculum and instruction in these areas, developing new methods to meet

these identified challenges. Anchor Bay Middle School South also uses the annual school improvement plan process to advance teaching and learning.

State law requires that we also report additional information for the two most recent school years.

- In the Anchor Bay School District, there are two middle schools, Children attend school based on the designated attendance boundaries. School of Choice applications are posted annually on the district website.
- The Anchor Bay School Districts meets the guidelines for school accreditation through Cognia. Each year, Anchor Bay Middle School South submits a school improvement plan to the Michigan Department of Education, outlining identified goals for student success. The academic goals for Anchor Bay Middle School South include improving reading informational text.
